

Ray Wood is one of the leaders of the New Zealand UNCLOS team who have just completed their discussions with the UN and reached agreement on the boundaries of New Zealand's continental shelf. Ray is a geologist and geophysicist. He started his career with Shell's research laboratory in Houston, and moved to New Zealand in 1979. He has worked for GNS Science and its predecessor organizations for almost 30 years. Ray has had extensive experience collecting and analysing marine geological and geophysical data from most parts of New Zealand's marine territory. He was part of the original team who started work on New Zealand's UNCLOS project in 1996. In addition to his work on the UNCLOS project, Ray was one of the technical advisors to the delegation that negotiated New Zealand's maritime boundaries with Australia, has presented numerous talks on the application of Article 76, and is helping several other countries to write their continental shelf submissions. Ray's co-author, Elana Geddis, is an international lawyer with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and was a head of the New Zealand delegation in New York.
