



International Hydrographic Bureau

- Representational duties
 - IMO, IOC, IALA, UN, ..., ...,
- Secretariat for:
 - IHO Conference
 - All Main Committees
 - 11 WGs (out of 22)
- Maintain
 - 14 standards
 - 30 other publications
 - 23 publications in at least two languages (French, English (and Spanish))

the development of related sciences and techniques



IHO Decision Making

- IHO decisions are made by consulting <u>ALL</u> IHO M/S
 Committees and WGs only make recommendations
 Voting represents the <u>government</u> position
 Majorities vary according to subject:

 ²/₃ of M/S
 - simple majority
- means at least 39 YES votes required
- This is normal procedure for most inter-governmental organizations



Participation

- M/S represented by official government delegates
- NGIO's speak for non-government interests and participate as observers
- Technical WG's may invite "technical experts" to participate as observers



Costs and commitment

SWPHC

- travel to regional meetings
- some access to IHO capacity building
- regional cooperation and coordination
- no financial contribution
 rotational chairmanship
 provide a regional voice

<mark>IHO</mark>

- travel to relevant meetings
- full access to IHO capacity building
- global cooperation, standards and developments
- annual contribution: ~ €10K
- provide a regional voice and lobby group
