IHO Work Programme 1 - "Corporate Affairs"

- Element 1.1 Co-operation with International Organizations and participation in relevant meetings.
- **Task 1.1.4:** EAtHC MS are involved in several projects of DG Mare: EMODNet; tendering for the future Coastal Mapping project; interaction about the Maritime Spatial Planning Directive.
- Task 1.1.6: Some EAtHC MS attended the Hydro2015 conference in South Africa 23-25 November.
- **Task 1.1.8:** IALA will be invited to the 14th EAtHC Conference 2016 to present their activities and tools to raise awareness about the involvement of IALA in the coordination mechanism between IHO/IMO/IAEA to improve the Capacity Building efforts of these organizations.
- **Task 1.1.12:** Mandatory IMO Audit Scheme was discussed at the last meeting, and concluded by the invitation of Member States of IMO which have not yet volunteered to be audited to do so as soon as they are ready.

- Element 1.2 Information Management.
- Task 1.2.4.1: During the 13th EAtHC, the Coastal States were asked to report regularly to IHB all information relevant for updating the status of hydrographic services and capabilities, including the provision of the list of POCs for the IHO Yearbook. IHO Yearbook to be updated by EAtHC once a year. IHB to add the date of the update for every Coastal State. No changes need to be reported as well.

IHO Work Programme 2 - "Services and Standards"

- Element 2.3 Nautical Cartography
- Task 2.3.2.6: Since the last EAtHC conference, IHB and the CHATINTCHART Coordinator have pooled their efforts to make the S-11 Region G (CHATINTCHART) catalogue update process more efficient. From now, the CHATINTCHART catalogue structure is compliant with S-11 format and every inputs/updates provided by charting authorities will be only addressed to the Regional Coordinator before transmission to the IHB. A Change of format of the Region G ICC WG/CHATINTCHART catalogue, which is now also available in kml and pdf format.

IHO Work Programme 3 - "Inter Regional Coordination and Support"

- Element 3.0 Inter Regional Coordination Committee (IRCC)
- Task 3.0.1: EAtHC chairman has represented EAtHC to the meeting of IRCC7 in Mexico (2015).
- Element 3.1 Co-operation with Member States and attendance at relevant meetings
- Task 3.1.6: EAtHC was represented in the MBSHC last conference (France).

- **Task 3.1.17:** the Coordinator of international charting schemes for the region G (G-ICCWG), (France) has represented EAtHC to fifth meeting of the WEND Working Group (3-5th March 2015-Singapore).
- **Task 3.1.18:** Industry participation is common and appreciated during the open session of EAtHC Conferences.
- **Task 3.1.19:** Members awareness has been raised about the request regarding the providing of national focal points response to marine disaster. In order to develop the assessment of the impact of marine disasters in the region, the members of the commission agreed to:
 - Identify stakeholders/networks/sectors vulnerable to Marine Disasters issues;
 - Define a common framework in line with both IHO and IOC mandates;
 - Adopt a strategy to be used in a IHO-IOC awareness program;
 - Organize an IHO-IOC regional workshop on marine disasters.
- Element 3.2 Increase participation by non-Member States.
- Task 3.2.2: All countries in the region are members/observers of EAtHC. 52% participation rate at the 13th EAtHC (Casablanca, 2014) despite of the Ebola crisis, increase participation of delegates [51 participants (37 in 12th EAtHC)] and the participation of 1 new observer (Angola).
- **Task 3.2.2.1:** Candidatures of Mauritania and Sierra Leone have received the number of votes allowing them to become members, but the Government of Monaco has not yet received their instrument of accession. Republic of Congo has sent to IHB a Letter of application to IHO membership on 22.05.2015.
- Task 3.2.2.2: See Status-EAtHC (action IRCC7/04) in paragraph 5.
- Task 3.2.11: See Status- EAtHC (action IRCC7/01) in paragraph 5.
- **Task 3.2.12.1:** The Government of Monaco has received notification of approval of the Protocol of Amendments from all IHO Member States of the EAtHC eligible to respond except Nigeria. Cameroon is not required to accede to the Protocol of Amendments since these were adopted before Cameroon joined the IHO.
- Element 3.3 Capacity Building Management
- **Task 3.3.1:** The Coordinator of international charting schemes for the region G (G-ICCWG) (France) has represented EAtHC to the 13th meeting of the capacity building sub-committee (27-29th may 2015- Mexico).
- Task 3.3.1.4: France performs the coordination of the dissemination of information on maritime security in the area Navarea II. This activity was the subject of a specific report (list of documents EAtHC13-07.4A report). If the status of Navtex stations has improved, the list of national contacts for Navarea II is still incomplete, complicating the task of the Navarea coordinator. The creation of a common web portal could likely facilitate the updating of these points of contact, while providing the capability to report information on maritime safety in a collaborative and responsive manner. All concerned Coastal States to identify all NAVTEX projects POCs, and respond to questions raised by IMO NAVTEX Panel in cooperation with the NAVAREA II co-ordinator.
- **Task 3.3.8:** The importance of developing regional capacity training has been discussed several times, at the 12th and 13th conferences of the EAtHC and at the seminary of Pointe-Noire in November 2013. Two orientations seem to emerge, on which it would be helpful to have the views of the commission:

- Need to train hydrographer-assistants, to leverage the potential trained at the B and A level;
- Interest of having an English speaking training centre and French speaking one (the question of a Portuguese speaking centre is to be considered with the SAIHC).

Element 3.4 Capacity Building Assessment

Task 3.4: A letter was sent by the EAtHC chairman to the Management Association of Ports of West Africa and Central (PMAWCA) to consider including special session on hydrographic capacity as an agenda item for discussion at its 37th Annual Council (2015). MOWCA was informed about this initiative.

Task 3.4.1: A high-level to MOWCA and a technical visit to Liberia (scheduled in 2015) has been postponed and added to the IHO CB Work Programme for 2016 (IHO Technical Visit to Liberia (3-5 February 2016).

Element 3.5 Capacity Building Provision

Task 3.5.6: The EAtHC commission kept on raising awareness of coastal States on the need to clarify and fulfil their SOLAS responsibilities by establishing bilateral agreements with charting authorities.

Element 3.6 Coordination of Global Surveying and Charting

Task 3.6.1.1: A permanent action has been approved at the last meeting for not IHO members to set up a table of national responsibilities (MSI, surveys, charts) based by default on the current charting authorities, in order to update C-55 database.

Task 3.6.3.1: The ENC coverage in region G continues to improve. Since the 12th EAtHC conference, over 48 new cells were produced on the region G (usage bands 4 and 5). Dissemination of ENC in the past two years has improved through the convergence of licensing rules of both

Task 3.6.4: Regional ENC Centres (RENCs). All existing ENCs on the area are provided through RENCs. INT Charts are managed by the Region G International Chart Coordination Working Group.

Task 3.6.4.1: The charting coordinator for the region was invited to consider the specifications of the IHO GIS "INToGIS" when available, to propose to EAtHC members the adjustments necessary to make the most of this GIS regarding maintenance of the chart catalogues of region G.

Element 3.7 Maritime Safety Information

Task 3.7.1: Based on the crucial need to consolidate contact management in the region for that purpose and the decision adopted by the commission to request MSI points of contact update from every Coastal State in the region, the commission, in coordination with the NAVAREA II Coordinator, continued on many occasions to urge Coastal States to update their MSI contacts, arguing the fact that some MSI contact details were still erroneous. This statement led the commission to consider the searching of new means of MSI dissemination in the frame of its cooperation between the maritime sub-regional bodies and the hydrographic community.

8. /9. Conclusions, achievements and lessons learned:

Some points achieved:

- IHO Technical Visit to Liberia (3-5 February 2016);
- Some actions taken by Côte d'Ivoire to develop its capabilities in hydrography and nautical charting by creation of a Coordination Center of marine Hydrography and Cartography;
- Good participation of industry in the last conference;
- The definition study for a long term capacity building project with the beginning of the analysis part (SWOT) in order to design the main development axes of the regional project that will lead to concrete proposals with eventually funding perspective.

All the components of the Eastern Atlantic Hydrographic Commission try strangely hard to develop their potentialities regarding hydrography, oceanography and nautical charting, as well as any other working axe relative to the different working programs specified by the IHO and other concerned International Organizations. The regional coordination within the EAtHC always remains fruitful except some ways of improvement such as MSI dissemination and strong governance of hydrography. Also, the cooperation with any sub-regional maritime organization such as MOWCA remains very beneficial and promising, and this can surely improve and bring to successful results for developing the maritime strategy of the region.
