


Fig 1. Location map of Chukochen Fracture Zone




Fig 2. Bathymetric map of Chukochen Fracture Zone (Contours are in 500 m)




Fig 3. Isobath and survey line map of Chukochen Fracture Zone (Contours are in 500 m, blue lines are survey lines)




Fig 4. 3-D topography map of Chukochen Fracture Zone




Fig 5. Topography profile map of Chukochen Fracture Zone
