Presentation of PSSA areas

on Baltic Sea nautical charts

(29 May 2007)

Introduction

IMO has approved Baltic Sea (except Russian waters) as Particularly Sensitive Sea Areas (PSSA) areas. [RESOLUTION MEPC 136(53), DESIGNATION OF THE BALTIC SEA AREA AS A PARTICULARLY SENSITIVE SEA AREA, Adopted on 22 July 2005].

The chart specifications for PSSA areas are in M-4 B-437.6. [Edition 3.003, August 2006].

In S-57 Ed.3.1.1 PSSA areas can be coded as attribute Category of restricted area (CATREA) value 28: Particularly Sensitive Sea Area (PSSA).

Proposal

Finland proposes that the BSHC decides on common recommendations how these areas should be shown on Baltic Sea nautical charts and publications, e.g. as follows:

- 1. **On printed charts:** Because the entire Baltic Sea (except Russian waters) is PSSA area, it is probably not feasible to show these areas with symbols. It may be enough to have a note on the chart legend. On general charts, perhaps also on coastal charts.
- 2. **On Notices to Mariners:** There may be a notice in the first edition for each year.
- 3. **In ENC:** The use of the PSSA attribute may be feasible on overview, general or coastal user bands.

Actions required from the BSHC 12th Conference:

The BSHC 12th Conference is requested to consider this proposal and to take appropriate actions.
