IHB Report

Status of Approval of Amendments to the IHO Convention

1. Amendments to the Convention on the IHO were approved by the 3rd Extraordinary International Hydrographic Conference in May 2005. By September 2013, 39 of the required 48 approvals to the Protocol of Amendments had been received by the Government of Monaco. The following IHO Member State of the BSHC has not yet indicated its positive support for the Protocol of Amendments:

2. The amendments to the Convention will enter force three months after the necessary majority of approvals is received by the Government of Monaco. This means that if the remaining nine approvals are received by the Government of Monaco before 6 July 2014, then the first Assembly of the IHO could be held in October 2014 instead of the 5th Extraordinary Hydrographic Conference.

Status of Approval of New Member States of the IHO

3. Since the last meeting, the required majority of IHO Member States has approved the membership of Haiti. Haiti, together with Bulgaria, Mauritania, Montenegro and Sierra Leone have yet to deposit their instruments of accession with the government of Monaco, to formally become Member States of the IHO.

4. Viet Nam, Brunei Darussalam, and Georgia have applied for membership of the IHO. By September 2013, the status of approvals was as follows:

6. The Directing Committee, in cooperation with the Department of External Relations of the Government of Monaco, stands ready to assist, through diplomatic or other channels, any States' representatives that may be encountering difficulties in progressing the outstanding approvals through their respective governments.

Regional Applications for Membership of the IHO

7. The Directing Committee, in cooperation with the Department of External Relations of the Government of Monaco, stands ready to assist, through diplomatic or other channels, for membership of the IHO of non-member State in the Baltic Sea region.

INT Chart and ENC Production Coordination - Region E

8. Finland, as INT coordinator for Region E, has continued to provide regular updates to S-11 Region E. Member States are encouraged to continue to provide updates to S-11, through Finland as coordinator for INT Region E.

IHO GIS Data Base

9. Work has continued on the development of the IHO GIS data base. The GIS database will have two main parts: a country database and a regional database. The country database will contain all relevant information about the coastal States in the world - similar to the information contained in the IHO Year Book. The regional database will contain geospatial information about the coverage and location of charts, surveys and related information. It is expected that there will be an upload capability that will allow States to keep the relevant information up to date. The regional data base is expected to provide the principal resource for managing international chart coordination, ENC coverage, as well as the identification of survey or charting "hotspots". The countries data base and a beta version of the regional database for Antarctica are now under evaluation.

IHO Publicity

10. World Hydrography Day. The proposed theme for World hydrography Day (WHD) 2013 is "Hydrography - supporting the blue economy". The purpose of this theme is to provide Member States with the opportunity to raise awareness of the importance and the benefits of hydrography, particularly in economic terms that will appeal both the public and to politicians. The IHB has provided some supporting material on the IHO website regarding the theme for WHD.

11. International Hydrographic Review. The IHR provides an ideal opportunity for Member States to publicise technical and other achievements in the region. An editorial board comprising a representative from each region has been established. The current representative for the BSHC is Dr. Mathias JONAS.
