



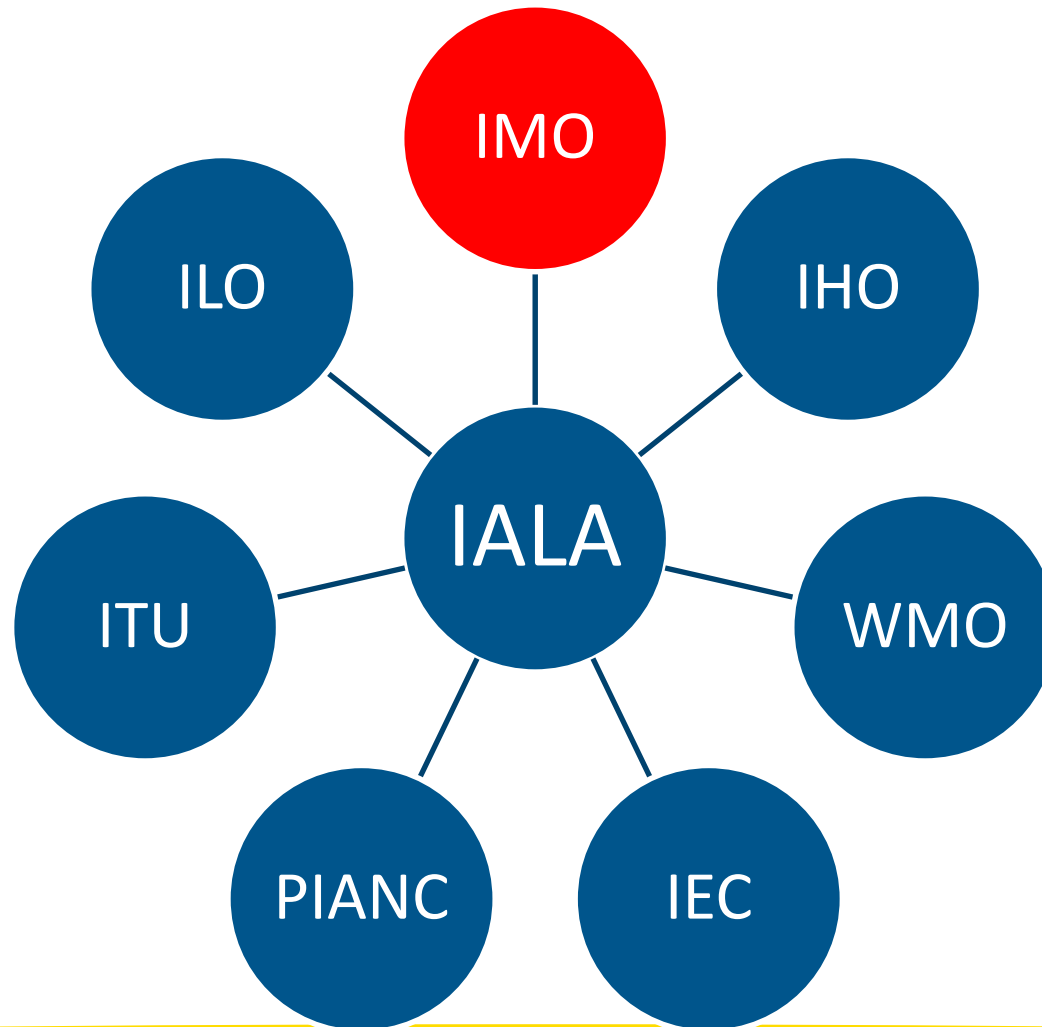

IALA Liaison with IHO

The International Hydrographic Office is based in Monaco. Its aim is similar to IALA in that it supports the safety of navigation and the marine environment by:

Coordinating the activities of National Hydrographic Offices (NHOs)

Setting common standards and uniformity for nautical charts and publications

Setting common standards for hydrographic surveys

Developing hydrographic and oceanographic technologies

Joint Capacity Building Working Group:

IMO; WMO; IOC (UNESCO); IAEA; IHO and IALA

Capacity-building activities related to safety of navigation and protection of the marine environment under the United Nations banner of “***Delivering as One***”.

Annual Joint CB group meeting pursues a range of CB activities designed specifically to meet the UN’s Millennium Development Goals and the post-2015 Development Agenda, particularly the protection of the world’s oceans and those that live and work on or near them.



IALA Liaison with other Major Organizations

International Telecommunications Union (ITU - www.itu.int)

UN Agency for information and communications technology

Coordinates the shared use of the radio spectrum (radars, Racons, AIS etc.) and satellite orbits through regional Transmission Regulatory Authorities



International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC - www.iec.ch)

Sets international standards for all electrical and electronic technologies including telecommunications

Standardizes terminology and symbols

IALA Industrial Members must comply





Other Organizations (II)

The World Association for Waterborne Transport Infrastructure (PIANC - www.pianc.org)

Non-governmental group of experts that develop cost-effective, reliable and sustainable technologies for the development of ports, waterways and coastal areas.
